We added a unique fundraising element to the 2020-21 year, which perfectly aligns with our "Make Giving a Sport" theme. A poster with inspirational quotes by sports greats was researched, designed and printed to be sold for \$25 each. All proceeds will go to Devereux Advanced Behavioral Health Georgia, the Circle's charity beneficiary, plus a poster will be given to each of the approximately 150 youth receiving treatment at Devereux.

Hundreds of famous quotes by celebrity athletes were considered and whittled down to 50. Then the children in treatment at Devereux voted for their favorites. The top 25 are highlighted in the final product, including quotes from such power athletes as Muhammad Ali, Mary Lou Retton, Brett Favre and Derek Jeter. The high quality poster is 36" x 24" and has a vintage feel with bronze-like lettering and a creamy background. The simplicity and neutral tones make it an easy addition to most rooms, whether a family room, bedroom or office.
