# The Circle for Children held a Spring General Meeting on May 23<sup>rd</sup> at the beautiful Atlanta Country Club in Marietta, Georgia.

The highlight of the evening was the presentation of contributions via large commemorative checks to our children's charity beneficiaries.

Wellspring Living Executive Director, Mary Frances Bowley was on hand to receive the Circle donation of \$40,000. She expressed gratitude for how much this money will help in the loving care and restoration of children who have been victims of sex trafficking here in Georgia.

The Circle also presented a check for \$5,000 to the Center for Children and Young Adults (CCYA) CEO Kimberley Borna. CCYA provides a safe and nurturing environment with comprehensive services for homeless youth who have been abused, abandoned, neglected, or are at risk.

Elizabeth Wiggs Cooper accepted a check for \$16,500 on behalf of the Circle Scholarship Committee to fund the Linda Gross Memorial Scholarship Awards that are given to deserving and needy students heading to college each year.

The Circle also made a deposit of \$6,000 into the Investment Account, bringing us within \$25,000 of our goal of having \$500,000 in the fund which will allow the Circle to fund scholarships from the interest on the account into the foreseeable future.

The Executive Board and Board of Directors were also sworn in.

# Lamar Trotti Linda Gross Memorial Scholarship Fund Update From Finance Chair Danielle Houret-Lam

Several members have asked for more information on our investment fund, the Lamar Trotti Linda Gross Memorial Scholarship fund. I am always thrilled when asked for any detail about Finance. I think it is important that everyone is well informed about the financial workings of the Circle.

The two questions I get asked most often are: can the money in the fund be used for purposes other than scholarships and why do we use proceeds from our events to add to the fund?

To answer the first question, I will give an extremely brief history of the fund. In 1932, five years after the Young Matron's Circle for Tallulah Falls School (TFS) had been established, Circle members began honoring fellow members by gifting the organization money in the form of perpetual scholarships. The amounts of these scholarships were often small, but the intent according to the minutes from that time kept at the Atlanta History Center, was to fund on perpetual basis scholarships for students both attending the TFS and graduates of TFS wanting to go on to higher education. These perpetual scholarships were invested so that the goal of awarding scholarships in perpetuity could be realized. These funds were eventually combined into two accounts, and in 2016 rolled into what is now the Lamar Trotti Linda Gross Memorial Scholarship fund.

Because this fund was started with money donated with the specific limitation that it be used only for scholarships, the money cannot be used for any other purpose.

Now onto the second questions: Why do we continue to add to the fund? Well, we have not always done this. In the 1980's and 1990's we often withdrew from the funds to pay for scholarships awarded at that time. A few of the funds were depleted and then the recession hit and our fund dwindled even more. If the Circle continued to withdraw monies to pay for scholarships, eventually we would no longer have a scholarship fund.

A couple years ago it was decided, with advice from our investment advisor, to begin adding money . . .

... to the fund, with the goal of reaching \$500,000. This amount of principal would allow us to award approximately \$15,000 in scholarships from the fund's proceeds without invading the principal. The would allow us to realize early Circle members dreams of awarding scholarships to deserving and needy students in perpetuity.

I hope I have answered the questions to everyone's satisfaction. I don't want to bore the masses with minutiae, but if anyone would like more detail please feel free to contact me!
